**RE: *Gilead Sciences New Research Center – TDM Compliance
Final Letter***

Dear Ms. Yang:

Gilead is planning to submit a Use Permit to the City of Foster City (City) for the New Research Center (NRC) building. The NRC building is a new lab building located in the South Campus of the Gilead Sciences campus in Foster City, CA. As part of the Use Permit, City/County Association of Governments of San Mateo County (C/CAG) requires that the Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Checklist be submitted with the development application. Therefore, Kimley-Horn is pleased to submit this C/CAG TDM Checklist for the NRC building. The NRC is proposed to be approximately 170,000 square feet to 200,000 square feet. Square footage estimation for the purposes of this TDM compliance is preliminary and should defer to the building permit submission. **Attachment A** includes the C/CAG TDM checklist, as required. In addition, to meet required Measure M4, Actively Participate in Commute.org or TMA Equivalent, the project is pre-certified under the Commute.org Certified Development Program (see **Attachment B**). The following provides additional information to support the TDM measures included in the checklist.

The NRC building will be constructed as part of the Gilead Sciences Campus in Foster City. As part of the Gilead Integrated Campus General Development Plan (GDP)/Mitigated Monitoring Report Program (MMRP), Gilead prepared a Transportation Demand Management Plan in 2013. For the TDM plan, all Gilead employees are provided amenities that help to reduce single-occupancy vehicle trips. Therefore, employees working in the NRC building, similar to all other Gilead employees, will have access to the multitude of amenities provided throughout the Gilead Sciences Campus, including, but not limited to:

- Secure bicycle storage is provided throughout the campus, including 116 bicycle lockers and 147 bicycle cage slots. In addition, 141 bicycle rack slots are provided throughout the campus. The nearest bicycle parking facilities are located around Buildings 324, 333, and 335, as well as Parking Garage 324.
- Showers, lockers, and changing rooms are provided throughout the campus. The Gilead Sciences campus has a total of 84 showers after the completion of the newly constructed Wellbeing Center. The nearest showers, lockers, and changing rooms are located in Buildings 324 and 335.

- Bike repair stations are located throughout the Gilead campus in Parking Garages 309, 355, and 324. The nearest bike repair station to the project is located in Parking Garage 324.
- Shuttle stops (total of three) are located throughout the campus. The nearest shuttle stop to the project would be near Building 353 to the south. Commute.org operates 20-passenger shuttle buses on 45-minute to 60-minute headways.
- The Guaranteed Ride Home Program is available to Gilead full-time employees. Employees may use this service up to five times per year and refund 100 percent of their emergency ride costs. Contract employees also have a Guaranteed Ride Home Program offered by Commute.org. Therefore, all commuters are covered by a Guaranteed Ride Home Program.
- The Commuter Subsidy Program is available to full-time employees that are interested in using an alternative transportation mode. Employees can receive up to \$100 monthly towards their transit or vanpool cost if they meet the program requirements. The transit subsidy can even be used by employees who use these public transportation options to connect with a Gilead commuter bus. The approved transportation modes are:
 - BART
 - Caltrain
 - Registered Vanpool
 - SamTrans
 - AC Transit
 - VTA Bus
 - Crowd-funded public shuttles

These subsidies go above and beyond the measures listed for M6 (Transit or Ridesharing Pass/Subsidies) and M7 (Pre-Tax Transportation Benefits) in the C/CAG TDM checklist.

- ATMs (Wells Fargo) are located throughout the campus near Buildings 300, 303, 309, and 333. The ATM nearest to the project is located near Building 333.
- Grab 'n Go food services are accessible during hours the cafeteria is closed.
- Dry cleaning services provided by PurpleTie are offered to Gilead employees. This includes drop-off locations in Buildings 301, 303, 309, 353, 324, and 378. The nearest location to the project is located in Building 324.
- Exercise facilities are provided to Gilead employees via ClubG in Building 305 (Wellbeing Center).
- Childcare facilities are provided to Gilead employees via Bright Horizons. This is located in Building 301.
- Cafes are provided throughout the Gilead campus in Buildings 303, 309, and 333; Building 305 (Wellbeing Center) also provides the Flourish Cafe. The nearest café to the project is located in Building 333.
- Commuter Long-haul Bus service, totaling 17 routes, is provided for Gilead employees.

- Flexible work schedules are allowed for Gilead employees. Gilead offers a corporation-wide flexible working policy. Employees may work from home on certain days of the week.

Since the above amenities are provided to all Gilead employees, including future employees in the NRC, the NRC would qualify for providing these TDM measures and are included in the C/CAG TDM checklist. With the TDM measures shown in the TDM Checklist, the NRC project would expect a total trip reduction of 54.5 percent. This 54.5 percent trip reduction would exceed the target trip reduction of 35 percent for a transit proximate project (project located within 0.5 miles to 3 miles from a high quality transit service).

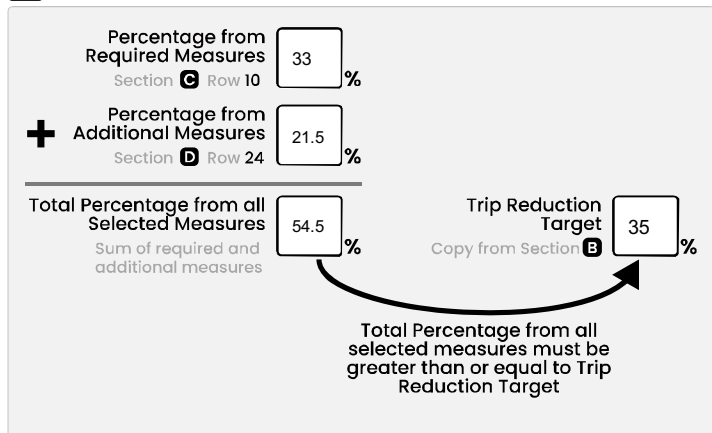
