Greetings,

The increase of anti-LGBTQ+ legislation across the United States has created an environment of fear, mistrust, and has taken significant impact on our mental health, even more so for the vulnerable members of the community.

On behalf of the LGBTQ Commission of San Mateo County, I am writing to ask for your support of the LGBTQ community in your city. The support that we request and suggestions we provide you are intended to bring visibility and inclusion to the forefront of your city for your LGBTQ residents. This visibility and inclusion allows your LGBTQ residents to know that they are seen and that they belong. During this continued time of isolation, social inequities, and division, these simple acts of visibility create a deeper sense of connection and inclusion for everyone in the community.

Please share this email with your city staff so they can follow up on any visibility efforts not already under way. We invite you to do the following that supports your LGBTQ residents during Pride Month.

- By May 1, remind Council or staff to Raise the LGBTQ Progress Rainbow Flag for the month of June. The LGTBQ Rainbow Flag has been part of the LGBTQ movement since 1978, designed by Gilbert Baker at the request of Harvey Milk (the first openly gay man to be elected to public office in the United States). The LGBTQ community and allies use the Rainbow Flag as an outward symbol of their identity or support. By raising the LGBTQ Progress Rainbow Flag, this highlights to your residents that Foster City is a leader in the fight for equal rights, and that you will continue to push not only protect the rights of everyone in Foster City, but to expand those rights.
- **Pride Month Proclamation** Issue a proclamation to declare June as Pride Month. A template proclamation can be found here.

*Here is why I include my pronouns: It's important to get pronouns correct to support belonging and respect in the workplace for everyone, inclusive of our LGBTQ+ communities. Pronouns are words used to refer to people and are often gendered (such as, she/her and he/him versus they/them). We cannot assume we can tell the correct pronoun for a person. An easy way to normalize the use of self-identified pronouns is to include them in your email signature and share them when introducing yourself in meetings. When we normalize the inclusion of pronouns, it will be more affirming for transgender, nonbinary, and gender diverse people to share theirs. Will you join me, in solidarity, to include your pronouns in your email signature?
