SUBJECT: CARRYOVER OF VARIOUS UNSPENT FISCAL YEAR 2022-23

BUDGET LINE ITEMS AS SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-24 BUDGET

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council/EMID Board of Directors (City Council) approve the attached resolutions authorizing the carryover of various unspent Fiscal Year 2022-23 budget line items as supplemental appropriations to the Fiscal Year 2023-24 City/EMID budget.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Due to various circumstances and conditions, City staff was unable to complete various FY 2022-23 tasks and projects, and/or such work plan items needed to be extended into FY 2023-24. This resulted in unspent FY 2022-23 budget appropriations associated with these work plan items that City staff is now requesting to be carried over to FY 2023-24 (as enumerated in Exhibit A) so that they may be completed in the current fiscal year.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The City Council adopts an annual budget each fiscal year with each City Department receiving financial resources necessary to administer and execute their respective work plans. In FY 2022-23, staff was unable to start or complete various projects due to numerous factors including supply chain delays, ordering delays, project initiation

delays, project continuation and extensions, staff turnover, and staff vacancies. Since unspent operating budgets lapse at the end of each fiscal year, the Community Development Department, Public Works Department, and Police Department are requesting carryovers of their various unspent FY 2022-23 budget line items to FY 2023-24 so that their associated work plans may be completed this fiscal year. A summary of the carryovers is as follows with additional details provided in the Exhibit A attachment:

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed carryover of the various unspent FY 2022-23 budgets amount to a total FY 2023-24 supplemental appropriation of \$1,469,115.
